



Well over 1000 years old, the "Old Tree" growing on Goose Island in southeastern coastal Texas is recognized by the Organization of American Forests as the largest live oak in the United States. With a circumference of over 35 feet, a height of over 45 feet, and crown of over 90 feet, many believe it to be the largest live oak in the world.

When the tree was asked how old it is,

Known as a ceremonial tree for the Karankaw
and a council tree for the Carancahua,
the tree has survived over 50 hurricanes, Spanish invasion, pirates,

in the strength of this essence from the Tree that Always was.
